Counting Back

Ask the learner to count back a higher number to a lower number.

Consider what number range is appropriate for your learner.

For example: count back in 8's from 1000.

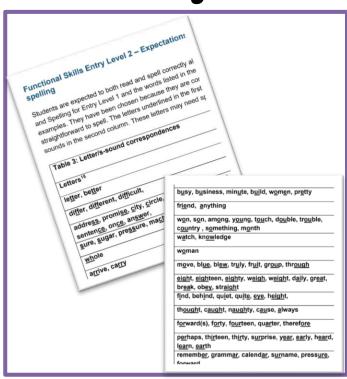


This follows the principles of diverting your thoughts. If a learner can concentrate on the counting back (this is a difficult task) then they will not be focusing on the thoughts that are frustrating them.

How can I use this in the classroom?

This can be used at any point in time with no preparation, some support may be needed/given depending on the person's ability or SEND.

Spelling Backwards



Pick a word of an appropriate difficulty, this could be the person's surname to start with, but then progress to longer words. For example: giraffe, communicate, multiplication.

Word lists provided are taken from the English Functional Skills subject content (2018).



This follows the principles of diverting your thoughts. If a learner can concentrate on spelling a word backwards (this is a tricky task) then they will not be focusing on the thoughts that are frustrating them.

How can I use this in the classroom?

This can be used at any point in time with no preparation, some support may be needed/given depending on people's ability or SEND.

Complete the below A-Z list. This can be whatever you want bands, songs etc.

SEND pathway



Provide the learner with a blank A-Z list and ask them to think of an item for each letter of the alphabet.

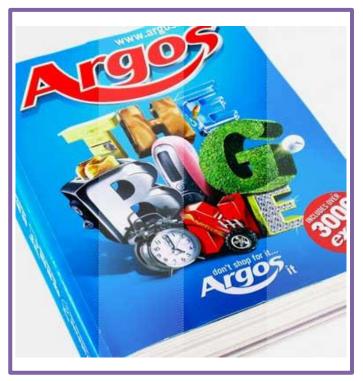
To make the activity more challenging you could give them a theme eg food & drink, football teams, cities, film/TV or countries.

This follows the principles of diverting your thoughts.
This task can take quite a while and needs quite a lot of focus.

How can I use this in the classroom?

People can find it frustrating so maybe use this with learners who are more competent or would find the task enjoyable.

E2,000 to Spend



Provide learner with a catalogue and give them a set amount of money to spend (eg. £2000). The leaners are then tasked to furnish a flat/house. The choice is theirs!





This could be extended in to being a scale drawing task or a writing task for Maths/English skills.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Learners generally enjoy this task as it allows them to do some shopping, they should be encouraged to make a list of purchases and costs.

Draw How You Feel

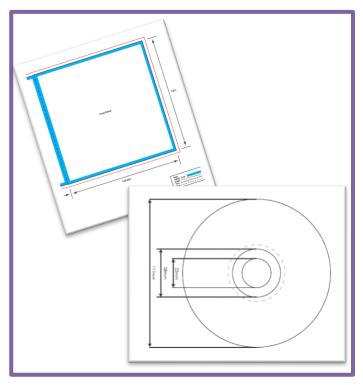
Ask leaners to draw a picture showing how they feel in that moment.



Some learners find it difficult to explain how they feel, this eliminates this difficulty and can be used as a stimulus for future discussions or for leaners seeing progress through managing their emotions

How can I use this in the classroom?

CD / DVD Cover Design



Provide leaners with a piece of paper/template for a CD/DVD cover. Ask them to produce the cover for their favourite film/artist.



Useful for leaners who don't want writing tasks and enjoying sitting and working at a task.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Film or TV Review



Depending on your learners ability this can be done as a written task using the model template provided or for lower level learners as a 'storyboard'.



Useful for leaners who don't want writing tasks and enjoying sitting and working at a task.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Collage

Using scrap pictures / magazines / catalogues etc learners can create a collage of their choice.

If the learner doesn't know what to make, you could ask them to create something for a family member or they could create from a photo/word prompt.

This task allows learners
"free rein" to create
whatever they want and
to express themselves.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Be aware of security issues if allowing leaners a pair of scissors.

Measuring the Room



Provide leaners with a template of the room/area you work in plus a measuring tape and ask them to measure the different aspects.

SEND pathway



Additionally, the learners could re-design your room/work area.

This task lends itself well to lower level learners as they generally enjoy the measuring activities.

How can I use this in the classroom?

This has particular relevance to the workshops or Maths lessons but can also be a good diversionary task for an English class.

Adult Colouring



Using pens, pencils or crayons (dependent on preference), the learner can select from a range of usually repetitive images to colour in.

Additionally, you could task the learner to use only certain colours, to create patterns as they colour or to draw new colouring sheets themselves.

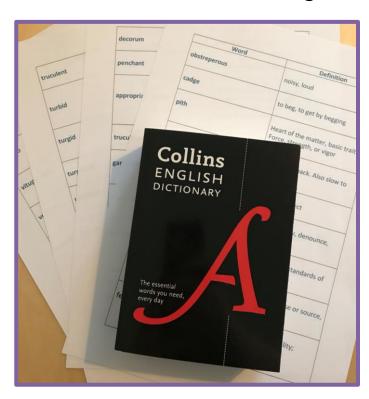


A very simple task which your learners will either love or hate.

How can I use this in the classroom?

This task requires concentration and focus and as such distracts leaners attention from their negative thoughts.

Word Tasks



Use a dictionary to find the meaning of the difficult / complex words.

The word list provided contains words on the left and definitions on the right to self check. All words on this list are in the dictionaries included in this toolbox.

SEND pathway



Great for embedding English skills into other lessons.

Use this task with learners who have a good level of English otherwise this could cause more frustration.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Anagrams



Using the clues learners decode the jumbled words to create a new word.

Additionally, learners could create their own anagrams + clues.

Great for embedding English skills into other lessons.



Have different lists 'levelled' to different ability levels.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Some learners may find this task very frustrating so think about the learners you are giving this to.

Word Ladders



Give the learner two words. Next, they use the word ladder to travel from one word to another. This is done by changing one (or 2) letter at a time.

Great for embedding English into other lessons.

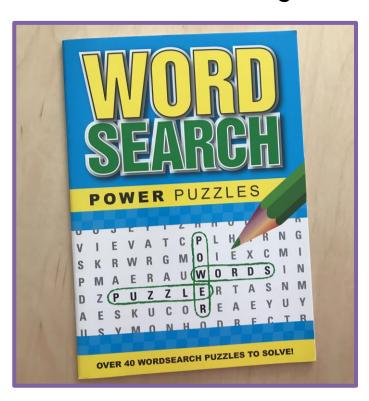


This task can be used in conjunction with another due to its quick nature.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Make sure the word ladder given is suited to the appropriate level of the learner.

Word Search



Provide the learner with a page from the book. You can also make your own word searches for free on the internet.

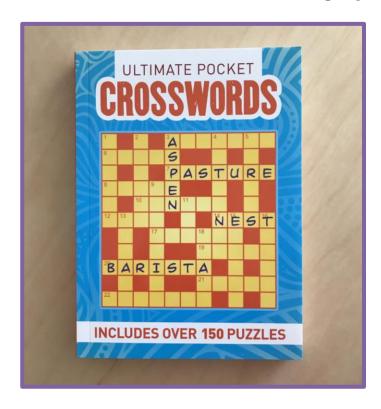
Great for embedding English skills into other lessons.



Suitable for use by individual learners as a mindfulness aid or to provide a break within the session.

How can I use this in the classroom? Also appropriate for completion in cell.

Crossword



Some crosswords provide cryptic clues and some provide the word but with missing letters.

Give the learner a page from the book or download from the internet. You can also create your own on the internet for free.

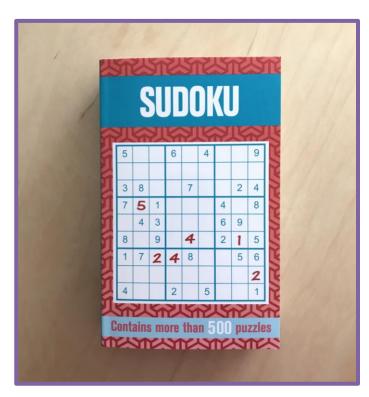
Great for embedding English and Maths into other lessons.



Suitable for use by individual learners as a mindfulness aid or to provide a break within the session.

How can I use this in the classroom? Also appropriate for completion in cell.

Sudoku



Sudoku is a number puzzle game split into 9 cells in 9 squares. Players must ensure that every number from 1-9 is written within each square, horizontal and vertical lines.

Provide the learner with a page from the book or download from the internet.

SEND pathway



Great for embedding Maths.

Suitable for use by individual learners as a mindfulness aid or to provide a break within the session.

How can I use this in the classroom? Also appropriate for completion in cell.

Poodling

Move the student to a quiet area if stressed and provide them with a note pad and pencils.

If necessary, you could provide them with a spoken or visual prompt.

Set up a signal with your students so they can that they can use to alert their teacher when they are anxious or stressed

How can I use this in the classroom?

Men in a Tree



A learner looks at the image of men in a tree and decides which image best represents them at that moment – and if able and appropriate, verbalises why.

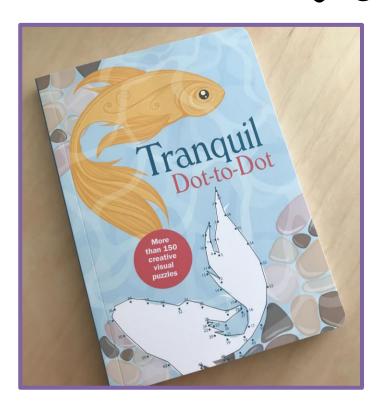
Tutor could introduce to their class in order to identify areas of stress or anxiety at the beginning of class and again at the end.



Can be used within a group or with individuals.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Pot-to-Pot



The book provided is the traditional dot-to-dot but includes images that are more pleasing to adults.

Provide the learner with a page from the book or download from the internet.

SEND pathway



Great for embedding Maths.

Suitable for use by individual learners as a mindfulness aid or to provide a break within the session.

How can I use this in the classroom? Also appropriate for completion in cell.

Fidget Cube



SEND pathway



This is a practical activity for stress and anxiety relief. The fidget cube includes 6 fidget activities on each surface of the cube eg. a switch, Xbox button, clicker etc.

Used as a stress release on arrival to lessons for those learners having anxiety over attending sessions.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Used throughout the session or when learner requires.
Used during a break period.

Tangle



This object is a plastic wiggly toy used to manipulate by rotating sections. Sections can be removed or added to. A standard tangle contains 18 sections.

SEND pathway



The tangle can be useful for stress and anxiety relief.

Used as a stress release on arrival to lessons for those learners having anxiety over attending sessions.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Used throughout the session or when learner requires.
Used during a break period.

Magic Ball



The aim of the activity is to concentrate on moving the balls around (by clicking and pressing them in) so that the coloured rings match the ball within.

This activity can be useful for stress and anxiety relief.



Used as a stress release on arrival to lessons for those learners having anxiety over attending sessions.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Used throughout the session or when learner requires.
Used during a break period.

Porcupine Ball



This small spiky ball can be held in the hand or rolled around.

This activity can be useful for stress and anxiety relief.



Used as a stress release on arrival to lessons for those learners having anxiety over attending sessions.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Used throughout the session or when learner requires.
Used during a break period.

Squeeze Ball



This foam ball can be used simply by squeezing in the palm of the hand either intermittently or whilst focusing on breathing.

This activity can be useful for stress and anxiety relief.



Used as a stress release on arrival to lessons for those learners having anxiety over attending sessions.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Used throughout the session or when learner requires.
Used during a break period.

Impossipuzzle



This jigsaw puzzle is extremely complex with the same image repeated over and over.

It can be a good mindfulness aid as it requires a lot of focus and attention.





Suitable for individual learners and small groups as a mindfulness aid or to provide a break within the session.

How can I use this in the classroom?

May encourage interaction within a group.

Calculated Colouring



These images are a more complex take on colour-by-numbers. The numbers are given but the learner must work out the sum to discover the colour they must use. There are varying levels of sums including addition, subtraction, multiplication, dividing and fractions.

SEND pathway



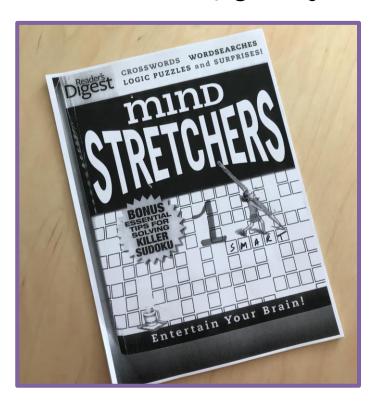

Suitable for use by individual learners as a mindfulness aid or to provide a break within the session. Appropriate for completion in cell.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Also useful for developing numeracy skills. Could be used as a starter or plenary.

Mind Stretchers



This book includes a wide variety of puzzle games including log puzzles, cross words, sudoku and word searches.



Suitable for use by individual learners or small groups as a mindfulness aid and to provide a break within the session.

May encourage interaction within the group.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Also appropriate for development of vocabulary/general knowledge and suitable for completion in cell.

Overlays



Overlays are a visual aid that can help people who may have difficulty reading text on white backgrounds.

Included in this toolbox are 2 coloured overlays (warm and cold colours) which can be placed over resources with text on them to help the learner focus their reading.



Suitable for some dyslexic learners who experience difficulties with reading and/or visual stress.

How can I use this in the classroom?

A range of colours are available and learners may also find it helpful to have resources printed on paper which is of the same colour.

Ergonomic Stationery



Ergonomic pens are moulded to the shape of your hand and can make writing easier and more comfortable for learners.

Included are pens for both right (blue) and left (green) handed learners. There are also 5 pencil grips which can be used with pens, pencils or crayons.



Suitable for learners with physical disabilities who may find it easier to grip a moulded pen

How can I use this in the classroom?

Calligraphy Pens



Calligraphy pens, pencils and handwriting pens can help learners with their handwriting skills.

You could download handwriting templates from the internet or you could write something yourself and ask the learner to copy.

SEND pathway



Calligraphy skills can also be a creative mindfulness aid.

Suitable for learners who may wish to improve their handwriting skills.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Calligraphy pens are also suitable for use as a mindfulness aid where learners are keen to develop calligraphy techniques/styles.

Mini Whiteboards



Mini whiteboards, mini board erasers and whiteboard pens can be used for a variety of tasks that are intended to be temporary.

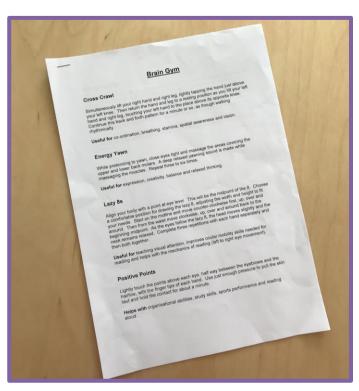


Suitable for learners who have spelling difficulties and feel more confident if they can practice and master spellings before writing onto paper.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Use as a memory aid to allow learners to jot down instructions or important information.

Brain Gym



A range of exercises and activities to help with organisation abilities, study skills, sports performance and reading aloud.



Suitable for individual use according to the guidance provided on the activity sheets.

How can I use this in the classroom? Use as a starter, break/time out activity or plenary.

Magnifying Glass



A credit card sized plastic magnifying glass which can help learners who have difficulty reading texts for varying reasons.



Useful for enlarging text/images when reading books, coping facts and completing worksheets.

How can I use this in the classroom? May also be helpful for any reading undertaken in cell.

Origami



"Some therapists have found that origami helps those with low self esteem, anxiety, ADHD, autism, mental retardation, and other psychological conditions. People who have been diagnosed with depression have found that origami gives them hope. The act of folding paper allows some of the inmates to decrease their level of anxiety. Some prison inmates fold origami models to give to their partners. What better way to encourage a healthful mindset."

SEND pathway

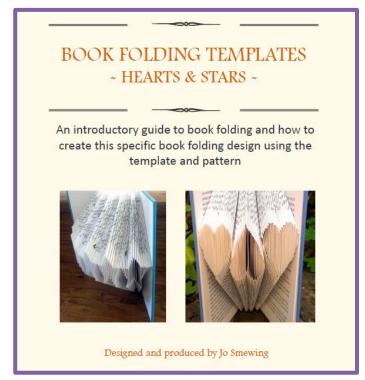

How can luse this in the classroom?

Book Folding



This guide shows you how to make two different folds (hearts and stars). The learners use a ruler like template in order to make the folds and then follow a numerical pattern to create their desired shape.

You will need an old book for the learner to use.

It is a good distraction activity and gives time out from lesson.

Great for embedding maths.



If learners are feeling anxious or need a little time out from classroom activities. These activities will also be completed over a number of days or weeks so can be quite motivating. If a learner has worked hard for an agreed period of time in class, they get to spend 15 minutes on their origami project.

How can luse this in the classroom?

Magazines



A variety of old magazines of different themes. Consider the topic of the magazines and level of appropriateness for your particular learner.

This is a good distraction activity and can provide time out from the lesson.



Time out activity. End of the lesson cool down.
Identifying writing techniques, grammar etc.

How can I use this in the classroom?

Embedding English into other lessons. Group discussion.
